

## **Marine litter**

- » Marine litter has negative effects on our marine environment as well as on tourism and recreational values
- » Fishing gear poses a particular threat as it can ghost fish for many years
- » Plastic material breaks into microplastics





- » SwAM implemens measures to reduce the amount of marine litter
- » Collaboration and coordination at both European and regional level (EU, Ospar, Helcom)
- » Monitoring important to inform the right policy decisions and is conducted on beaches and on the seafloor
  - Beaches (calculate and categorize on a number of reference beaches)
  - The seafloor (piggyback on ICES fish studies)





